## Proof of qualified energy property for claiming tax credits for residential heat pump water heaters

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) made important changes to the homeowner tax credits for specified energy-efficient home improvements. Two of the more significant revisions include the extension of the tax credit through 2010 and the increase of the total available tax credit from 10% to 30%.

Heat pump water heaters with an EF rating of 2.0 or better qualify for a tax credit equal to 30% of the full purchase price and installation labor costs if the product is purchased and installed between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2010. There is a cap on the tax credit of \$1,500. This \$1,500 cap applies to all qualified energy property purchased by the consumer.


